SKILLS & QUALITIES

I am an empathetic and people-centred person, who is passionate about communicating. Exploring human connection and experience is at the centre of all I do; within my work at school, my relationships and also in my making. I am good at working with and relating to people and I love to create a personable relationship with clients and students; building on a mutual report through respect, engagement and creating an inclusive environment.

As a jeweller, I am able to create settings and set stones, smelt and recycle precious metals and use resins to make keepsake jewellery amongst a range of other silversmithing skills. I am the chair for the jeweller's collective 'Alloy' which is a Herefordshire based group of jewellers and small metal based artists. We are all independent makers but collectively have a shared workshop within The Courtyard and we have worked together to curate exhibitions and design challenges. We also support graduate jewellers from the local art college yearly, running a graduate mentoring programme, of which I am a mentor.

I have held a variety of roles within our church at Christian Life Church, where I have helped with the welcome team, children's work and lead evening study groups. Being Christian is a centrally important part of my life and is integral to the values and the approach I bring to people and work ethic. I have a deep love of people and I am motivated to do my best in all I do.

Mental health has played a large part in my life; as a teenager I struggled with mental health issues and still live with the impact and learning which occurred in those years. I have worked voluntarily for both CAMHS, Bernardo's and the CLD trust, as a participation worker to help young people engage with raising awareness of mental health issues, accessing support and self referring as well as designing and delivering training to those who work with young people in a non-medical capacity.

I have also volunteered as a NHS trained peer breastfeeding support worker, having worked for a year in the community supporting women with their latch, attachment and positioning of breastfeeding and being a point of contact to further sign post for more complex or medical support. An aspect of this role is also safeguarding vulnerable women, as there may be warning signs or indicators of abuse or mental health issues which as peer supporters, we can record in the appropriate ways and then pass on to our Line Manager.
